WEST YORKS STP (5 year plan to 2020/21): summary of official "information"

Aims: to address the 3 gaps set out in the NHS 5 Year Forward View

- health and wellbeing
- care and quality
- finance and efficiency (aiming to achieve balance by 20/21)

Covers: 11 CCGs and 6 Local Plans (currently 2 year plans) Bradford and District, Calderdale, Harrogate and Rural District, Kirklees, Leeds, Wakefield

Total Catchment population 2.5million

Predicted funding gap they want to close: £988m by 20/21 (mmm! Leeds alone predicted to be £723m!)

NB. NHS Planning guidance suggests the STPs will become the single application and approval process for being accepted onto programmes with transformational funding for 2017/18 onwards.

Has 9 Priority Areas:

Acute Collaboration Primary and Community Care Stroke

Cancer Specialised Commissioning Urgent and Emergency Care

Mental Health Standardisation of

Prevention "at scale" Commissioning Policies

States as the vision:

- o every place will be a healthy place, focusing on prevention and health inequalities
- o we will work with local communities to build community assets and resilience for health
- o people will be supported to self-care as a standard offer
- o technology will be key to supporting people in their communities (local digital roadmaps required)
- o care will be person centred, simpler and easy to navigate
- o there will be joined up community place-based services across mental and physical health and social care including close working with voluntary and community sector
- o acute needs will be met through services that are "safe sized" with an acute centre in every major urban area, connected to a smaller number of centres for excellence providing specialist care
- o we will move to a single commissioning arrangement between CCGs and local authorities
- o we will share back office functions, where possible, to drive efficiencies to enable investment in services
- o local services will merge into accountable care systems to help keep people well
- West Yorkshire will be an international destination for health innovation

Leadership of the West Yorks STP: Rob Webster Chief Exec of South West Yorks Partnerships NHS Foundation Trust was appointed NHS England as lead. Key figures in CCGs in the footprint lead on different sections/issues. Julian Hartley, chair of Leeds Teaching Hospitals Trust chairs the West Yorkshire Association of Acute Trusts.

Timescales

- Final Submission of draft West Yorks Plan 21st October
- Draft submission of local CCG &Provider 2 year operational plans '17-'19 by end November
- CCGs and providers to finalise 2 year operational plans by 23rd December 2016. The STP sets the strategic framework for the operational plans.

Engagement : Draft proposals to be published after 21.10.16. These are being planned and managed by the West Yorkshire Healthy Futures Programme Management Office, which is funded by the 11 CCGs.

NB You will also come across re-balancing the conversation / social contract with service users and public ie reducing their expectations of health care, having a flexible workforce ie staff shut up and put up, ensuring the skill mix of staff matches need ie pushing tasks down the qualification chain and expecting volunteers, relatives and neighbours to pick up the tab — also known as community asset building, investing in activities which provide the biggest return ie rationing and targeting services on particular areas ie increasing post code lotteries etc etc.!
